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Return to School Plan – Whitefish Township Community Schools

Our School **WILL be FACE TO FACE** in the fall. With that being said, below you will find steps that we will be taking to ensure the health and safety of all of our students and staff. These guidelines are composed by Mr. McKee and the staff at Whitefish Township Community Schools and are subject to change if mandates come out from the state level. We have **FOUR PLANS for continuity of learning for our students.**

Plan One: Region 8 is in level 6 of the Mi Safe Restart Plan (Post-Pandemic) we will move forward with school four times a week and Fridays will be online.

Plan Two: Region 8 is in level 5 of the Mi Safe Restart Plan (Containing) we will move forward with school four times a week and Fridays will be online.

Plan Three: Region 8 is in level 4 of the Mi Safe Restart Plan (Improving) we will attend school three days a week (Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday) and have school online one day a week (Friday) from 9:30-1:30.

Plan Four: Region 8 is in level 1 or 2 or 3 of the Mi Safe Restart Plan (Uncontrolled Growth or Persistent Spread or Flattening) we will have school online three days a week from 9:30-1:30.

Q: What if someone in our school is diagnosed with Covid-19?

A: In the event that a student or staff member is diagnosed with Covid-19, the school will close for seven to ten school days. During this time, the school will be cleaned and disinfected. The staff will continue to teach students electronically and this will be MANDATORY for the students to participate.

Q: What is the second wave hits our state and we have to shut down school again?

A: In the event of this happening, all learning will transition to online and be MANDATORY. Students will be given hot spots and computers to be able to complete their work online and will need follow along the course outlines provided by their teachers.

Q: Who will be making the decision for opening and closing the school?

A: During the course of the year, Mr. McKee and the Chippewa County Health Department will be in consistent communication. At the advice of the medical professionals in the Health Department, Mr. McKee will be making a weekly or monthly call on school. These things may change from time to time quickly so it is vital that all parents and guardians have up-to-date phone numbers with the school.

Additional Information:

Items in this plan are likely to change as we progress into the next few months, but for now, this is what can be expected. If you child is ill, has a fever greater than 99.9 degrees (We understand that the average temperature of individual students is flexible and some students have normally higher temperatures when they are feeling well, these points will be taken into consideration at all times), has a sore throat, pink eye, a cough, or generally doesn't feel well, please keep them home. If you are called about your child being sick, you will need to pick them up in a timely manner. If you cannot find transportation to pick up your child from our school when they are sick, then maybe our school is not the best place for your child to learn at. We cannot have sick students sitting in our school all day like they have in the past. The office will call you twice to pick up your child. If arrangements cannot be made to get them, law enforcement will be contacted.
